TO THOR'S CAVE

Fhor's Cave is an impressive cavern on the edge of the Manifold Valley near the village of Wetton. The valley is an accessible part of the Peak District but still feels wild and rugged. It's a brilliant day trip and an exciting adventure for children of all ages. There are several routes to Thor's Cave, either from the valley or from Wetton at the top. I've included a longer, full-day route (Route 3), which would be suitable for intrepid schoolaged children. There is a café at Wetton Mill that serves hot and cold drinks, cakes and sandwiches so you can refuel at the end of your walk.

If you visit in the spring, expect to see hundreds of early purple orchids. In the summer. you will find a wide variety

of wild-flowers growing in the species-rich limestone grassland carpeting the valley slopes. You will also find butterflies such as the small blue, meadow

brown and small heath varieties.

The ancient woodland on the steep valley sides is also very special with twisted trees covered with moss and ferns and the woodland floor is carpeted with wood anemones and lesser celandine. The river that flows through the Manifold Valley often disappears underground into the porous limestone and only comes to the surface in wet weather. We enjoyed stacking rocks on what would have

been a beach at the stream edge and clambering over rocks in the river bed.

This part of the Manifold Valley is part of the Manifold Way, which is a nine-mile off-road cycle route. The path surface is very good and you can easily take a pushchair or cycle along here. Once you go off this path there are steep and stepped sections, which are only suitable for walking. You will need a bike lock so you can leave your bikes at the bottom if you'd like to climb up to Thor's Cave. It can get very busy on weekends and during the holidays. Take advantage of the quieter, spring weekdays when it's more peaceful.

DIRECTIONS - It's a 45-minute drive from Belper. Take the A515 through Ashbourne towards Buxton. Be aware, the roads are narrow and winding once you turn off the A515.

PARKING - There are several places (marked on the map) to park and start your walk: Route I - Wetton Village Hall, Wetton, DE6 2AF. Routes 2&3 - Wetton Mill Tea Rooms, Wetton Mill Road, DE6 2AG.

Please note:

There are sheep grazing in many of the fields, so please keep your dog on a lead. Take care near the edges; there are very shear drops. The limestone can be slippery, where it has been polished by visitors to the cave, especially when wet.





Kerry Gill is a local mum, professional wilderness manger, forest school practitioner and co-founder of Stepping Stones child-led play group.

ROUTE I – Park in the Village Hall car park in Wetton. Turn right onto Carr Lane and then take the first right. Turn left onto Leek Road and you will see the footpath to Thor's Cave on your left through the field. Follow this path into the woodland until you see a wooden way marker signed left to Thor's cave. This winding woodland path has several sections of steps but you will be rewarded with Thor's Cave. sitting impressively in front of you. After exploring the cave, if you are feeling adventurous, you can follow the path that goes above the cave. There are impressive views of the valley from up here.

ROUTE 2 – Park at Wetton Mill Café. I walked this route with my 3 ½ year old and I year old in a carrier with ease. My eldest loved the cave and was very excited to walk up on to the top. Looking down to where we had walked, and the view of the valley, is pretty spectacular.



ROUTE 3 — This circular route is longer than the other two. There are good views of the valley. It takes you along the Manifold Valley and then up through Ladyside Wood. It is worth the detour to explore Thor's Cave, but this will add time and an extra hill to your route! (See Route 4)

SUMMER TIPS

Ahhhh the summer... a time of sticky ice cream faces, sticky sun cream applications and more often than not, a sticky, hot mess of a mummy! We'll be ok though... there are always sticky sweet cocktails to help us cope!

Here are a few tips to help your summer with the kids go smoothly – well at least until that wondrous chime of the cocktail hour...

Create a summer survival kit for your car or under the buggy.

I always keep a bag in the boot of the car brimming with towels and spare swimwear for the kids, because there are splash pads in the strangest places - we even found one at the zoo! Any parent with a water-loving child knows that when they see those amazingly freezing cold outdoor showers, there is no stopping them - so best to be prepared! I also keep a picnic blanket in the survival kit, sun cream, sunhats and light weight waterproofs for me and the kids, because you know, British weather! Plenty of wet wipes are a must for that

summer stickiness!
Finally, I always keep a small change purse because an unexpected ice cream van on a hot day + a parent with no money = EPIC toddler melt down!

Keeping little ones protected from the sun is really important in the summer.

I really like the UV blackout sunshades you can get for your pram or buggy. They offer blackout and UV protection but also airflow to help keep your little one cool. I find them much less stressful than trying to use a buggy parasol, which I've seen on lots of strollers, but how do they get them to stay upright!?... superglue?!



3. Clip-on buggy fans are amazing!

Last summer we took a trip to the Mediterranean with our then four month old, and I was a bit worried about her being too hot so I bought a clip-on buggy fan. It was really cheap but powerful, and the blades are made of safe soft foam. I even turned it to face me on more than one occasion, because pushing the buggy up a hill in 30 degrees heat is quite frankly not fun!





There's no need to rummage in the bottom of the changing bag. They are just there, ready and waiting - I'm not sure if I mentioned that summer is sticky?!?

For some fab outdoor fun this summer, get some giant chalks.

Or even spray chalk! Let the kids go wild on the slabs in the garden... don't worry, the rain will wash it all away pretty quickly!

6. Remember the snacks.

Ooh the kids love their snacks! Get creative making homemade lollies, you can control the sugar by using no added sugar cordial, and let the kids help by adding fresh fruits. WYVER LANE

WALK FOR LITTLE LEGS

yver Lane is an excellent family walk that suits all ages. Children (and adults!) who love to watch trains will have a close-up view of the railway line at the start of the walk, while the adjacent fields have sheep and horses for your animal enthusiasts. You will also pass the Wyver Lane Pool Nature Reserve where in the summer you can see swallows, swifts, house martins and occasionally peregrine falcons.

Park at the River Gardens (parking charges apply). Cross the bridge with stunning views of the weir below on the Derwent River. Take the first right into Belper Lane, and then take the first road on your right called Wyver Lane. Follow the lane as far as it goes, passing beautiful tended gardens and the River Gardens Park on your right. At the end of the lane, the houses stop but the road continues to the left. The pushchair accessible walk ends at 1.5 miles from the carpark at a squeeze style gate. Take care not to trespass on the private woodlands to your right. After the squeeze style gate, you can follow other paths towards Shinning Cliff Woods, or turn back for a three mile round trip.

Please note: This walk is pushchair friendly but there are several footpaths off to the left, which you can take if everyone is on foot. Occasionally a car will pass, but they tend to drive very slowly. Wyver Lane is flat with paved or gravel surfaces but there can be very large puddles. Wellies and a pushchair with large wheels are recommended.

What's Cooking? Vegetable Biryani

Ingredients
65g basmatirice
25g frozen peas
25g sweetcorn
1/2 chopped carrot
Small handful of raisins
1/2 vegetable stock cube
1/2 Tbsp korma curry paste
Handful of cashew nuts
(aptional)

Instructions

- I) Add the rice, vegetables and raisins to a 400ml baking tin.
- 2) Pour ½ pint of water over the rice mixture and crumble in the stock cube.
- 3) Stir in the curry paste.
- Put the lid on the baking tin and place on a baking tray and cook in a preheated oven (200DC / Gas 6) for 25 minutes.
- Leave to stand for 5 minutes then fluff the rice with a fork and if you like, scatter with cashew nuts, before serving.

IS IT OK TO PICK

WILDFLOWERS?

Some of my most vivid and happy childhood memories are being outdoors and picking wildflowers. I'm sure you can all remember playing "he loves me, he loves me not", making daisy chains and blowing dandelion clocks on warm summer days. This is where my love of the natural world and in particular my deep fascination in plants began.

There has been some debate recently about picking wildflowers. On Mother's Day a man videoed a police officer who had confiscated daffodils that his daughters had picked from a roadside near Mansfield. We were all taught the countryside code and know that we shouldn't damage, destroy or remove anything from the natural world but I'm sure at some point in your lives you've taken home a pebble from the beach or picked a flower from a hedgerow. Where do we draw the line, when does it become a problem?

The conservationist in me says we shouldn't be picking wildflowers. They are an important nectar source for our suffering bee population and our wildflower meadows have diminished by 97% since the Second World War, leaving us with an area roughly the size of Bristol. But if we don't engage and enthuse our children about nature then it becomes something inaccessible. The less we understand the natural world, the greater the threat our countryside will face.

But how will you know if something is rare, how will you know if it's ok to pick or not? Plantlife have published a code of conduct to guide you and I welcome their common sense approach:

- I. Make sure you're not trespassing.
- **2. Never pick flowers from nature reserves or any other protected sites** (such as Sites of Special Scientific Interest).
- 3. Only pick from large patches of abundant flowers, leaving plenty of flowers for others to enjoy, to set seed, and to provide other wildlife with pollen, nectar, seed or shelter.
- **4. Follow the one-in-twenty rule,** picking one flower out of every twenty you find. You should never diminish the display.
- Only pick a small handful of flowers for personal use, you must never pick for commercial gain.
- **6. Don't trample** other flowers or vegetation.
- 7. Never uproot any plant and be aware that some plants (listed on Schedule 8 of the Wildlife and Countryside Act) cannot be picked without a licence.
- 8. If in doubt, don't pick. If you don't know the identity of a plant, leave it where it is. Take a photograph instead and try and identify it at home first.

How can you learn more?

Simply go for a walk and look what is around you. the Field Studies Council produce laminated sheets on everything from wildflowers to butterflies that provide you with the common British species.

Visit **www.plantlife.org.uk** to download their app, a spotter sheet or take part in the Great British Wildflower Hunt this summer.

FOOTWEAR AND FOOTSTEPS by Natasha Levy, MSc, BSc, MChS, FHEA

As a Podiatrist, at parties I used to get asked all the time about foot pain, how to find the best trainers for running, if bare foot running is a good idea, and if wedges are better than platforms. (If I've made you curious about your feet, come and chat with me!) Now that I'm a mum I still get asked about feet, but the most common question now is: "How do I buy the right shoes for my toddler?". Here is a guide to finding the right footwear for your child's feet, and why measuring is so important.

Children's bones are still growing.

At birth, babies' feet are made of little blobs of bone, which gradually develop into 26 separate bones.

Foot bones transition from being soft and squishy, a bit like the cartilage in your nose, to fully formed by 18 years of age. So, if a child's shoe does not fit properly, it is very easy to misshapen and squash their soft bones into a different shape.

Children's feet are a different shape to adult feet.

In simple terms, a child's foot is more like a triangle, narrow at the heel and broad at the toes. An adult's foot is more like a rectangle, so children's shoes should look different than ours. Mini versions of adult footwear are not always a great fit.

Toddlers will probably grow through two full shoe sizes per year.

By age four or five, foot growth probably slows down to one full size per year. If your toddler is shooting up in height, it's likely their feet are growing too, so it's worth checking if their shoes are getting too tight or too small.

Feet don't always grow at the same rate. It is perfectly normal for one foot to be a bit bigger than the other as we grow, don't worry. Things normally even out, given a bit of time

What is a good shoe?

A good shoe protects the foot. Ideally it should have a flexible rubbery sole, a rounded front and a fastening to hold the shoe in place. Laces, Velcro or buckles are all absolutely fine; their job





is to hold the heel into the back of the shoe to stop the foot sliding forwards and crumpling the toes. The shoes should also have growing room at the toes; about a little finger's width of space from the toes to the front of the shoe.

What should their shoes be made of?

Natural materials such as leather and suede are great as they are soft and will gently stretch to the shape of the foot. Canvas is ok for summer shoes, but avoid stitching near the toes, whatever they are made of, as stitching does not stretch and could squash the foot if the shoe is too tight.

How do I buy the right shoes?

Always get your child's feet measured for length and width, before committing to buying any new shoes. Tight shoes can cramp up a foot and cause problems such as hard skin, corns or ingrowing nails. Shoes which are too wide and long can allow the foot to slide about inside the shoe, causing blisters, and a child may scrunch up their toes to hold the shoe in place.

Feel your child's foot through their shoe.

You should be trying to feel where their toes end, and looking if the shoe is too wide or baggy on the sides. Get your toddler to sit down (if you can stop them playing hide and seek and running around the shop!) and give the sole of the shoe a tug at the heel, if it slides off their foot, this is not a good fitting shoe. I would highly recommend getting shoes fitted by trained fitters whenever you can.

What if you know their shoe size and width, but your child is not with you in the shop?

Draw round your child's feet, do this on cardboard and cut it out, write the date on it and you have a bespoke shoe measuring device. So if you come across a shoe without a width fitting you will be able to see if it would be too big or too small. I would suggest redoing this each month.

I hope this has given you a bit of an insight. Happy shopping!

TIPS ON STAYING BALANCED AS A BUSINESS OWNER AND MUM

Mummypreneur, Entrepreneur, Work-at-home-mum, Bossbabe. These are some of the titles given to women who decide to turn their back on the 9-5. It's perceived as glamorous - just check out the #bossbabe on Instagram for pictures of women living a high-flying lifestyle and drinking champagne.

The reality is something quite different. In the early days of starting a new business it is extremely hard to find any kind of balance. I have put together a few tips to help stop the pendulum swinging quite so wildly from manic to completely burnt out.

Get help

Enlist your partner (if you have one), a cleaner, a nanny, a dog walker, grandparents, someone to do the ironing, window cleaning, car valeting ... It's time to pony up the cash for any task that you can delegate at home and for your business.

You can use a virtual assistant, a marketing management agency, a graphic design company, an accountant and a veritable smorgasbord of other trades to do jobs that are not best suited to you.

Why are these things important? Because to make cash, to build your business, you need to focus on IPA – Income Producing Activity. It may cost you around £25 a week to hire a cleaner but in the two hours they're cleaning you will be earning more than that. Plus: YEAH - CLEAN HOUSE!

SCIENCE FUN WHATEVER THE WEATHER

Spring is here!

Flowers are blooming, birds are singing and some longer, warmer days on their way. Here is a range of creative science-based activities, as variable as our spring weather, using simple supplies that are easy to find. Some activities you can do outside; others work well indoors. Some activities have an element of both, because, well, some spring days are like that!

Science was my speciality as a teacher. I just love seeing the awe and wonder on a child's face as they experiment and make discoveries. Science is all around us: when mixing paints, playing with water, exploring ice and watching gravity at work when dropping sticks off of a bridge. This makes it easy to take a simple craft or activity and add a scientific spin. Things can get messy but, at this time of year, it's another reason to go outside!

We love the freedom of painting outside, especially on a large scale, on old rolls of wallpaper for example. You can print with whatever comes to hand - found materials such as feathers and pinecones or even your own body! Focus on the process and encourage experimentation. Even children who are not keen to make marks, can flourish into budding Picassos when using big paper outside, as they enjoy the freedom. Also these big movements are really good for developing the muscles needed for writing. Encourage your child to watch the colours mixing, and try adding different amounts of water to make the paint thicker or thinner. Or, draw on the paper first with a white wax crayon, then paint over the top and watch how the wax crayon repels the paint. Add a ramp and some little cars and you can talk about gravity and experiment with how far the paint tracks go by adjusting the angle of the ramp.



Not all art needs to be permanent. You can use chalk, and paint with water too. Add water to chalk and watch it transform from powder to liquid as the colours merge. The transient nature of this art makes children feel less restricted and more willing to explore. You can paint on anything that will go darker when wet, using whatever tools you have. Large paint brushes and rollers work well, but you can also use finer brushes for more detail. Once the water starts fading, you can discuss evaporation, and this activity now becomes a science experiment.





When it comes to exploring colours and textures, cornflour goop is absolutely mesmerising. Put a generous amount of cornflour onto a tray. Give the children a minute to explore the silky-soft fine powder with their hands. Then add water, mixing and mashing it together until it's a consistency that, when squeezed, becomes hard and crumbly, but when you release it, you have an oozing liquid. Add some

colour by sprinkling in liquid water colours or paint and discuss how the colours blend. On warmer days, add ice instead of water for an added scientific element.



If it's an inside day, your child can make their own playdough. Simply mix 2 cups of plain flour, 2 tablespoons of vegetable oil, ½ cup of salt, and 2 tablespoons of cream of tartar. Then slowly add 1½ cups warm water mixed with a little paint. Stir it first and then knead until smooth. You can also make stretchy dough by adding 1 cup of hair conditioner to 2 cups of cornflour. This makes the most incredible silky and soft playdough, which is perfect for children who enjoy exploring texture rather than making anything specific. Make your playdough a little more interesting by adding different scents and colours.

Another simple sensory science experiment is bicarbonate of soda mixed with white vinegar dyed in different shades. Watch as the chemicals react and fizz, and the colours mix. This can be done outside in a builder's tray, or in a smaller tray inside.

Teaching children basic science concepts can be simple, creative and fun. And no matter the weather, there should be an activity here for you to enjoy!

RAISING KIDS IN

Australia is a great place to raise a family. We have a 6-year-old boy and an I I-month-old girl and we love being outdoors. We live in Shellharbour, 1.5 hours south of Sydney on the coast, in the Illawarra. We are lucky as the climate is mild all year round, averaging 17 degrees in the winter and 27 degrees in the summer. Saying that, we have had a particularly long, hot summer this year; the temperature hit 40 degrees in March (which is autumn for us). A warmer climate can present challenges when it comes to your kids.



When getting the kids ready for their day there's one item that can't be left out of a school or nursery bag, and that's a hat. Sun safety is drilled into kids from a young age and schools have a 'no hat, no play' policy. We put on sunscreen (SPF 50+) before we walk out the door and it's re-applied throughout the day.

Got a thirst

Keeping the kids hydrated is important and water bottles are an essential addition to the kids' bags. On particularly warm days we put ice cubes in water bottles.

Keeping it cool

Air conditioning is a relief on a hot day. Our home, son's school and daughter's nursery are all air conditioned. When waiting in the school car park I often leave the air conditioning running in the car to keep my little girl from melting.

Even though we have flyscreens on our doors and windows, some bugs still make their way indoors. We live in the suburbs and get spiders, flies, cockroaches, beetles, snails, slugs and ants. When it comes to spiders, our son knows what to look out for and we have a rule - 'if you see a spider, come and tell us'. If we leave shoes outside, we check them before putting them on to make sure no uninvited guests have moved in.


